1. Obtain the date, time-frame altitude, and location where the drone will be flying.
2. Provide the information to Flight For Life by calling 414-778-3466.
3. Flight For Life will post the information to the hazard reporting site Weatherturndown.com that can be accessed by all flight programs regardless of location.

Conversely, if a department or subcontractor will be using a drone on or near your hospital campus, please provide the following information.

1. Contact Flight For Life in advance at 414-778-3466 and provide the date, time, altitude, and location where the drone will be flying. If the date and/or time changes, please notify Flight For Life with the updated information.
2. Call Flight For Life Communication Center when the drone pilot is ready to launch their drone.
3. Provide the cell phone number of the staff member who will be escorting the drone operator.
4. Flight For Life will contact him/her if there are incoming flights during that time and he/she will be asked to land the drone temporarily.
5. Our Flight Communicator will post the information on Weatherturndown.com for all other flight programs to access.

If the above information is located anywhere else please adjust it to reflect the above changes.
